Federal Allocations per State Under the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) authorized the Treasury Department to split distribution of Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Funds into two equal payments to state governments, "except for states where the unemployment rate is 2.0 or more above its prepandemic level."¹ Twenty states and the District of Columbia received their full share of state funding in 2021, and the remaining 30 states will receive a second payment this year, currently scheduled for distribution in May 2022. Total State & Local Funding (the second column) includes state, county, city & municipality funding under ARPA's Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds.
