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HEIGHTENED NONPROFIT AWARENESS THAT LED TO MORE THAN 38,000 COMMENTS BEING FILED IN OPPOSITION TO THE IRS' PROPOSED GIFT SUBSTANTIATION RULES THAT WOULD HAVE OPENED THE DOOR FOR SCAM ARTISTS STEALING DONORS' IDENTITIES AND EXPOSED NONPROFITS TO UNNECESSARY LIABILITY. SEE, E.G., "'NEVER' IS THE BETTER ANSWER" (HUFFINGTON POST, DEC. 8, 2015). THE IRS WITHDREW ITS PROPOSED RULES IN EARLY 2016, CITING THE STRONG OPPOSITION FROM THE NONPROFIT COMMUNITY AS ITS REASON FOR DOING SO. IN A SEPARATE REGULATORY ACTION, THE COUNCIL OF NONPROFITS DEVELOPED THE CORE LEGAL ANALYSIS THAT FRAMED MUCH OF THE SECTOR'S RESPONSE TO THE PROPOSED LABOR DEPARTMENT OVERTIME REGULATIONS, AND CRAFTED THE PRACTICAL POSITIONING DISTRIBUTED THROUGH NUMEROUS NATIONAL NONPROFIT GROUPS TO PROTECT THE SECTOR FROM BEING DRAWN INTO THE HIGHLY-CHARGED PARTISAN DEBATE.

THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NONPROFITS WAS PROUD TO PARTICIPATE ACTIVELY IN NONPROFIT ADVOCACY EFFORTS TO ENACT LEGISLATION MAKING PERMANENT CHARITABLE GIVING INCENTIVES FOR DONATIONS OF FOOD INVENTORIES, CONSERVATION EASEMENTS, AND FUNDS FROM INDIVIDUAL RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS. THE PASSAGE OF THE PROTECTING AMERICANS FROM TAX HIKE ACT OF 2015 (PATH ACT) BUILT UPON OUR EARLIER WORK IN PULLING TOGETHER DIFFERENT PARTS OF THE NONPROFIT SECTOR THAT PREVIOUSLY HAD BEEN ENGAGING IN SEPARATE AND SEGREGATED ADVOCACY EFFORTS.

IN 2015, OUR NETWORK PREVENTED THE DIVERSION OF RESOURCES DEVOTED TO ADVANCING CHARITABLE MISSIONS IN COMMUNITIES BY WORKING TO DEFEAT LEGISLATIVE THREATS TO LIMIT CHARITABLE GIVING INCENTIVES IN HAWAI'I, KANSAS, NORTH CAROLINA, AND VERMONT. NOTABLY, WE DEVELOPED A DATA ANALYSIS BASED ON EXPERIENCES IN OTHER STATES THAT DEMONSTRATED THE

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ADVERSE EFFECTS OF CURBS TO GIVING INCENTIVES. THE ANALYSIS, CREATED FOR THE DEBATE IN ONE STATE, PROVED REPLICABLE FOR USE IN SUBSEQUENT CHALLENGES THAT YEAR AND IS A KEY TOOL FOR FUTURE CHALLENGES.

THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NONPROFITS CONTINUED ITS EFFORTS IN 2015 TO REFORM FLAWED GOVERNMENT-NONPROFIT GRANTMAKING AND CONTRACTING SYSTEMS BECAUSE DATA DEMONSTRATE THAT THIS WORK CAN HAVE THE MOST IMMEDIATE AND SIGNIFICANT IMPACT ON NONPROFIT SUSTAINABILITY AND PERFORMANCE. BECAUSE GOVERNMENTS DEPEND ON NONPROFITS TO DELIVER SERVICES TO THE PUBLIC, THE NONPROFIT SECTOR AS A WHOLE EARNS ALMOST A THIRD OF ITS REVENUE (32.5 PERCENT) BY CONTRACTING TO PROVIDE SERVICES TO THE PUBLIC ON BEHALF OF GOVERNMENTS. OUR FOCUS PRIMARILY IS ON COLLABORATIVE PROBLEM SOLVING WITH GOVERNMENTS TO REDUCE REDUNDANCIES, ENSURE REIMBURSEMENT OF NONPROFIT INDIRECT COSTS (PER THE OMB UNIFORM GUIDANCE), EDUCATE NONPROFITS AND GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS ON EFFECTIVE REFORMS AND PROMISING PRACTICES - ALL DESIGNED TO REDUCE COSTS FOR GOVERNMENTS AND NONPROFITS ALIKE, WHILE ENHANCING TRANSPARENCY AND IMPROVING PERFORMANCE FOR THE BENEFICIARIES OF SERVICES.

NETWORK SUPPORT - THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NONPROFITS IS A TRUSTED RESOURCE AND ADVOCATE FOR AMERICA'S CHARITABLE NONPROFITS. OUR MISSION IS TO ADVANCE THE VITAL ROLE, CAPACITY, AND VOICE OF CHARITABLE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS. WE DO SO PRIMARILY THROUGH OUR NETWORKS, COMPOSED OF OUR MEMBER STATE ASSOCIATIONS OF NONPROFITS, THEIR MEMBERS, AND OUR OTHER MEMBERS, THAT TOGETHER CREATE THE LARGEST NETWORK OF NONPROFITS IN THE COUNTRY.

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NETWORK SUPPORT REFERS TO OUR ROLE COORDINATING MANY COMMON ACTIVITIES OF THE STATE ASSOCIATION NETWORK AS WELL AS IDENTIFYING EMERGING TRENDS, SHARING PROVEN PRACTICES, AND PROMOTING SOLUTIONS THAT BENEFIT ALL CHARITABLE NONPROFITS AND THE COMMUNITIES THEY SERVE. WE CONVENED OUR CORE NETWORK MORE THAN 25 TIMES THROUGHOUT THE YEAR, IN PERSON, AND VIA TELECONFERENCES/WEBINARS, TO GATHER AND CIRCULATE INFORMATION THAT INFORMS THE STATE ASSOCIATION NETWORK ABOUT PUBLIC POLICIES AND PROMISING PRACTICES FOR THEIR OWN CAPACITY BUILDING WORK IN THEIR STATES. WE ALSO HOSTED A NATIONAL WEBINAR ON COSTS AND THE IMPORTANCE OF NONPROFITS "OWNING THEIR OWN COSTS" FOR EFFECTIVENESS, FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY, AND TRANSPARENCY PURPOSES.

WE PROMOTE "BEST PRACTICES" BECAUSE WITHOUT PRUDENT AND ETHICAL OPERATIONS, NONPROFITS WON'T BE EITHER SUSTAINABLE OR CREDIBLE AND TRUSTED PARTNERS FOR INVESTMENTS BY GOVERNMENT, PHILANTHROPY, OR PRIVATE DONORS. WE ALSO PROMOTE FAIR AND EFFECTIVE STATE AND FEDERAL REGULATIONS, AND ENFORCEMENT OF THOSE REGULATIONS, TO ENSURE THAT NONPROFITS EARN AND CONTINUE DESERVING THE PUBLIC'S TRUST.

COMMUNICATIONS - THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NONPROFITS UTILIZES MULTIPLE COMMUNICATIONS VEHICLES TO SPREAD TRUSTED INFORMATION ABOUT NONPROFITS. FOR INSTANCE, THROUGH OUR WEBSITE THAT IS UPDATED DAILY, WE REACHED A MILESTONE OF 1 MILLION SESSIONS LOGGED ON OUR WEBSITE IN A SINGLE CALENDAR YEAR IN 2014, AN ACHIEVEMENT WE REPEATED IN 2015.

THROUGH OUR BI-WEEKLY ENEWSLETTER "NONPROFIT ADVOCACY MATTERS" AND OUR

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MONTHLY CAPACITY BUILDING ENEWSLETTER "NONPROFIT KNOWLEDGE MATTERS,"

THE COUNCIL OF NONPROFITS KEEPS MORE THAN 22,000 NONPROFIT STAFF MEMBERS, BOARD MEMBERS, ATTORNEYS, CONSULTANTS, CPAS, ACADEMICS, JOURNALISTS, AND ELECTED AND APPOINTED GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS INFORMED ABOUT NONPROFIT ISSUES AND SOLUTIONS FROM ACROSS THE COUNTRY. THE 36 EDITIONS OF THE TWO NEWSLETTERS HELP TO SPREAD INFORMATION, GATHER INFORMATION, PROVIDE SENSE-MAKING, AND OFFER PERSPECTIVE.

NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NONPROFITS STAFF MEMBERS ALSO WROTE NUMEROUS ARTICLES, OP-EDS, AND OTHER PIECES THAT WERE PUBLISHED IN MAINSTREAM AND NONPROFIT PUBLICATIONS, AND RESPONDED TO FREQUENT REQUESTS FROM REPORTERS FOR INFORMATION AND QUOTES.

ADDITIONALLY, COUNCIL OF NONPROFITS STAFF MEMBERS DELIVERED SPEECHES, PRESENTATIONS, AND WEBINARS ACROSS THE COUNTRY ON A WIDE VARIETY OF TOPICS - FROM ADVOCACY AND PUBLIC POLICY TO ETHICS AND LEADERSHIP.
